

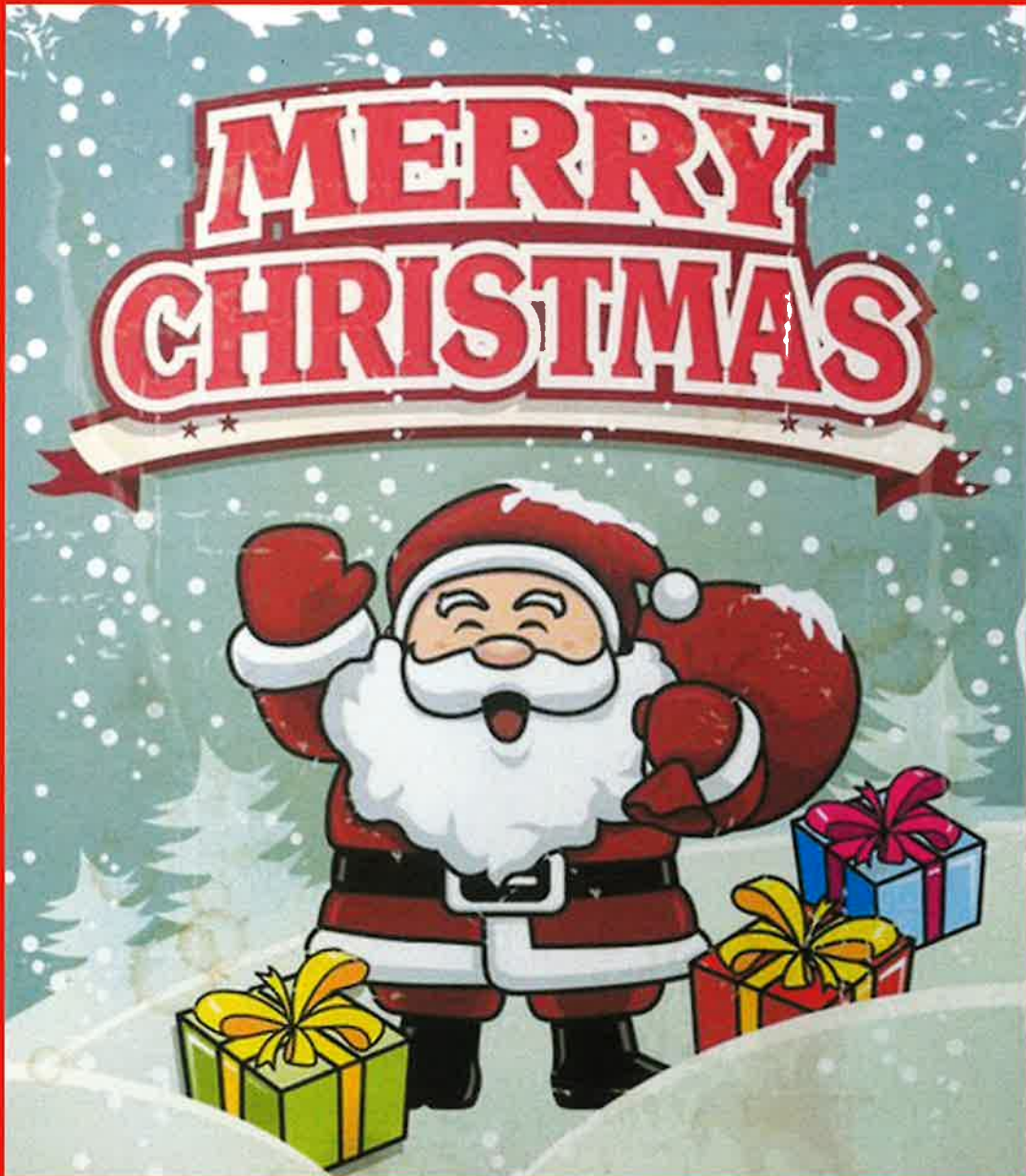

What is the most exciting thing that happened in your life? The birth of my children.

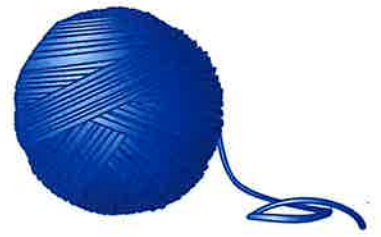
