









THEY ALL STOPPED BUT ONE

As the Course Broadcaster, Jack Gorman, called "They're Off" in the Noss Steeplechase at Casterton, in the second Winter Meeting on July 23rd, 1966, an ominous calm had seemed to settle over the Course. Apart from the intermittent voices of the Interstate Bookmakers as they called the odds, and the comentator's "call" as the field raced in the direction of the first jump, a growing hedge, it was strangely silent.

The Steeplechase course at Casterton, where the horses leave the Course Proper, and race across open country in the direction of the "Junction", the meeting place of the Glenelg and Wannon Rivers, is one of the most gruelling and spectacular steeplechase courses in Victoria, and the club, which regularly frames its programmes with two jumping races, a hurdle race and Steeplechase is one of the last strongholds of jumping races in Victoria.

The field of eight runners had sixteen jumps to negotiate. The start of the Noss Steeplechase took place in the centre of the Course and the horses race through a gap in the Course Proper to the first one which is a formidable fence in open country off the Course Proper. For Cross country riders who have never ridden at Casterton, before the first jump is a very tricky obstacle.

Racing very tightly in a well bunched field, there was a lot of jostling amongst the horses for positions as they

came to that first jump.

Doneraile ridden by Bill Cannon and Bryn ridden by Brian Smith, bumped together and both fell. Then Far Off ridden by G. Campbell, and The Peon ridden by Ray Shepherd fell on top of them. Campbell was not injured but the other three jockeys were left lying on the ground unconscous, as the ambulance and doctor raced to the fallen horses and stricken jockeys.

The other four runners - Sailor's Gold - Jim Walter, Open Aim - Bob Newman, Attaviros - Peter Maney, and Larusness - Pat Ryan left standing, raced towards the first turn by the Junction, and headed for "The River Table", all growing hedges, and travelling through the gap over the Course Proper, and all fencing well, raced in the direction of the four jumps in front of the stand, bringing them back to where they had started.

With some of the injured jockeys still lying where they had fallen at the first jump, utter confusion reigned, as bystanders raced onto the Steeplechase Course, waving white handkerchiefs, and shouting loudly at the jockeys who were racing to the fence again in the second lap.

An unidentified person gesticulating and waving a large white handkerchief to the Course Broadcaster shouted,

"You've got to stop the race."

It was a chaotic situation. Any view of the landing side of the first fence was obscured from the Patrons. As the four runners raced to this fence they eased their mounts down, and in the confusion all four riders pulled up.

Jim Walter on Sailor's Gold, after having a quick look at the landing side of the fence, decided that there was ample room and safety to jump the fence and continued in the race. Fencing on his own now with only phantom horses and jockeys for company over the last seven furlongs, Sailor's Gold safely completed the course, and was placed first by the judge.

Pandemonium reigned. The punters who had backed the horses who fell and the ones who had pulled up wanted it "Declared no race". The lucky punters who had backed Sailor's Gold were queueing up to the bookmakers wanting to get paid.

In the mix-up the Club's Timekeeper forgot to time the race. The rules at that time provided that the race could only have been stopped if there had been a false start, if the weights were wrong, or if the race had been run over a wrong distance.

Fortunately no jockeys were seriously injured, and although what the patrons who had entered the Steeplchase Course and the Course Broadcaster (who was censured by the Steward) had done was in good faith, it was contrary to the rules of racing of that day, and the decision by Mr. Brian Kavanagh and his panel of Stewards in "Declaring Correct Weight" in the Noss Steeplechase was the right decision, afterwards fully vindicated by the V.R.C.

Who is your hero or the person you most admire? My mother who is a nurse and a single mum. She is the strongest person I know.


What is or has been your greatest achievement? Moving on my own to a foreign country.

Star Wars Day

4th May

In a Galaxy Far, Far Away.....



May the fourth has become Star Wars Day for its close resemblance to the catch phrase, "May the force be with you". Regardless of whether you are a fan or not, the Star Wars phenomenon has had a huge impact on modern life. It has introduced a number of sayings and spin off/ copies of the movie. Star Wars was an epic movie that was written and directed by George Lucas and premiered in 1977. It became a worldwide smash hit. Audiences had seen nothing like it before, sat in the theatre watching the enormous words scroll up the screen at the beginning of the movie, then the special effects which today seem so basic and yet, back then, were just fantastic! Ronald Reagan even called his Strategic Defence Program "Star Wars". In 1979, Margaret Thatcher's political party in Britain was the first to coin the phrase "May the Fourth be with You" to congratulate her on her win on the 4th May 1979.






