From the CEO



The most important update is around the “Freak Super Cell Hail Storm” that hit Casterton. It appears that just about the whole population of our town was effected by this.

Edgarley was significantly effected with : Roof, walls, floors, ceilings, electrical, smoke detectors, motor vehicles, air conditioning units and gardens all damaged. It is going to take many months before we ALL are up and running to full capability with the amount of work it will take for the entire town to recover.

The ability to open the new Doctors Clinic at Edgar House will be delayed while work is done to make the house safe.

On a different note I attended the National ACCPA Conference in Adelaide (ACCPA is the Aged Care Industry Peak Body that supports and advocates on behave of the Industry with Government). It was an opportunity to network with other Industry related services and hear from Government about the future of aged care. There will be changes in 2025 regarding the Funding Model for Aged Care and the Introduction of the New Aged Care Act and Standards.

To ensure that Rural and Remote services are represented and have a voice, I nominated for the ACCPA State and National Council which was accepted. I am now one of the 15 council members for Victoria for a 3 year term. I promise to work hard to ensure that issues faced by Rural and Remote Aged Care gets heard.

Edgarley Assisted Living Annual General Meeting at this stage has been set for Tuesday 26th November at 6:30pm with supper at 7:30pm then the First meeting at 8 pm for the election of the Board positions that are due. All association and public are welcome. Only current Association members can vote on the Board positions. The meeting will be held at Edgarley in the Alma Vickery Room.

Christmas is also around the corner with only 56 sleeps to go. Resident and relative Christmas functions will be announced shortly. Staff Awards for 2023/2024 and Family Christmas night will also be announced shortly.

Business arising from previous meeting:


