**Previous meeting read and passed, seconded by Nancy Roberston**

**Business arising from previous meeting:**

- Dinner bell well-received by residents and staff alike, though discussion ensues on the number of times the announcement rings-out, with some feeling 2 times would suffice, as opposed to the current 5. There is also talk about switching the recording out for a female voice.
- Updates on central heating: handyman Malcolm Hill explains that residents are of course free to switch their air conditioning system on/off at their leisure, but stresses that doing so will cancel out its automatic functions. The system is designed to heat up rooms that are under certain temperatures, and cool down rooms that are above certain temperatures.

### **General Business:**

**01: Gentle Music:** Residents are interested in having some light tunes play over the PA system while they eat their main meals, with particular interest in Christmas tunes, given the season.

This will be passed on to Malcolm Hill.

**02: New Bus:** During the weeks that the Edgarley bus was MIA due to hail damage, the local hospital had been kind enough to lend their own bus for Edgarley's use. Residents were very impressed with the bus's modern setup and myriad features, and requested that Edgarley perhaps look into an upgrade of our own. Suggestions sent to Continuous Improvements Officer Patricia Mckenzie.

**03: New SUV:** Edgarley's new car, a white SUV, has been well-received by residents, though some find it troublesome to get into due to its height. Use of step-ladder will be implemented for these residents.

**04: Cold chicken:** A resident had issues with her chicken for lunch, commenting that it was too cold. News will be passed on to the kitchen.

**05: Thanks to Kitchen:** On the subject of food, residents heartily thanked the kitchen for their hard work cooking the Residents & Family Christmas Lunch. Everyone had a wonderful time, and the food was delicious.

**06: Live Music:** Discussion about potential live performers coming to Edgarley, with suggestions including David Byrne (a favourite), Peter Noulte, and Russel the pianist, who played piano for us during the Ladies Auxiliary Christmas Break-up luncheon.

**08: Christmas Carols:** Residents invited to listen to a local group of carollers who were kind enough to come in and sing for them today. Meeting adjourned with many residents eagerly heading to the lounge to listen to the good cheer.

Little Johnny looked up and replied, "Well, Ms Smith, you can't say you weren't warned."



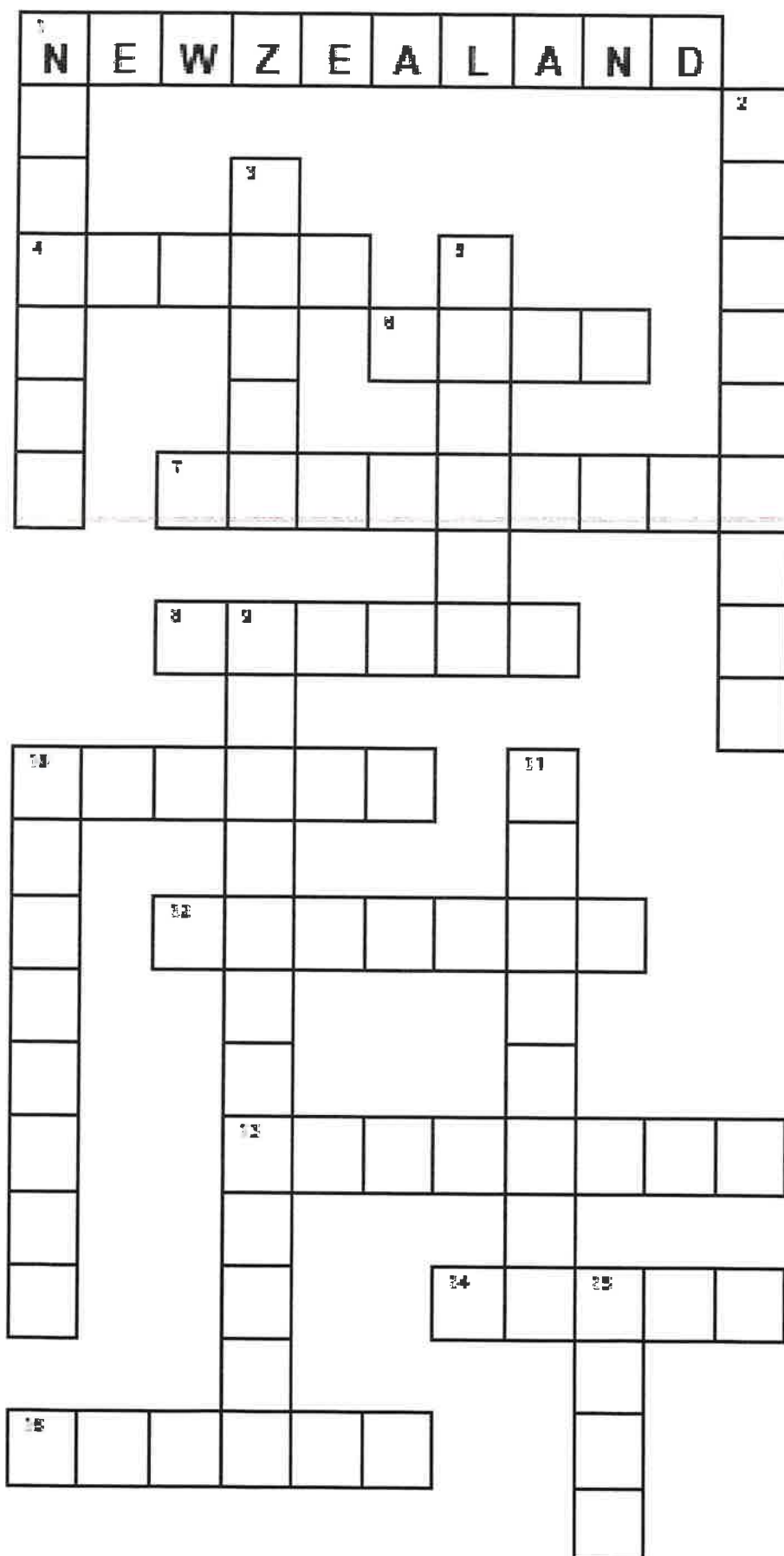

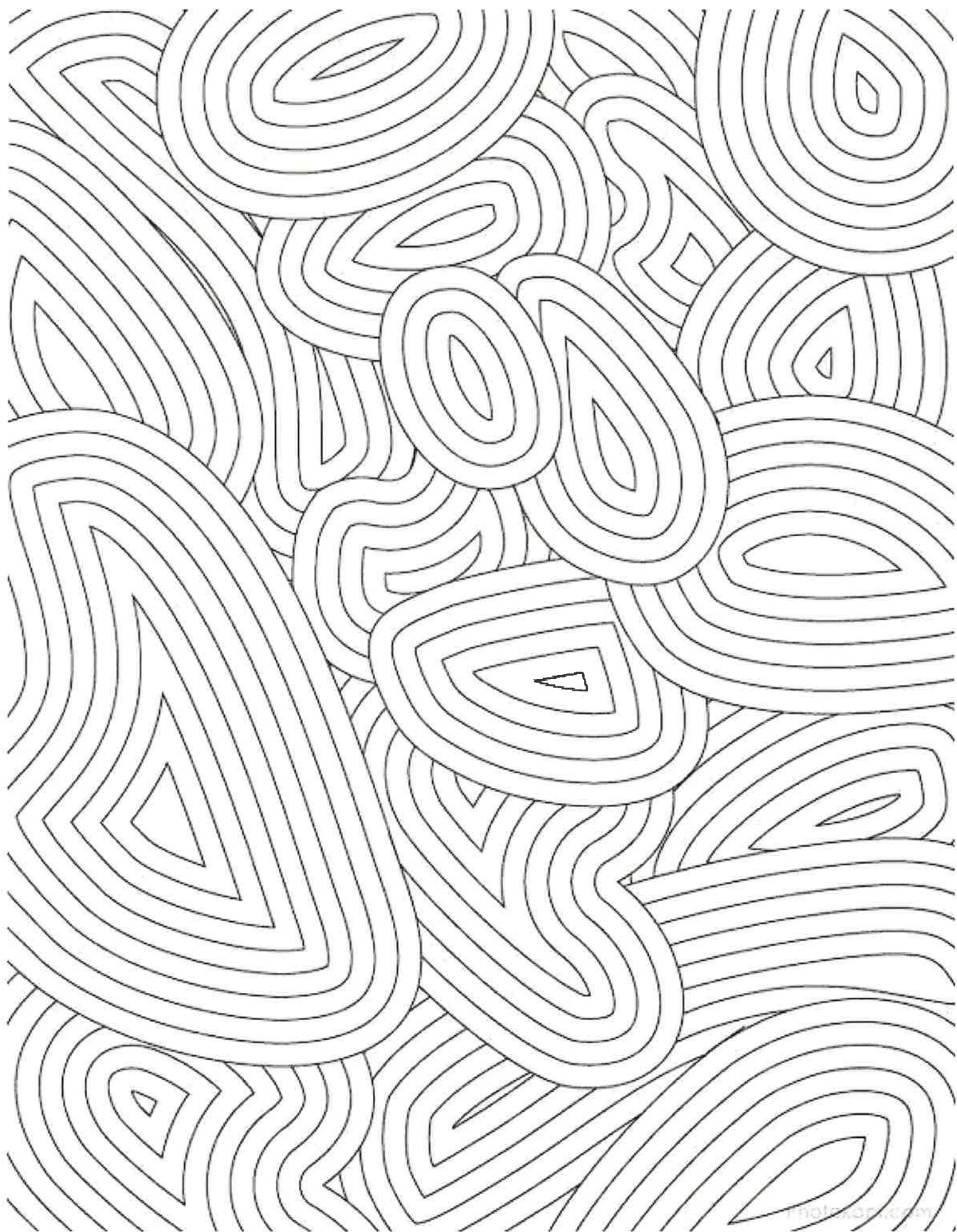

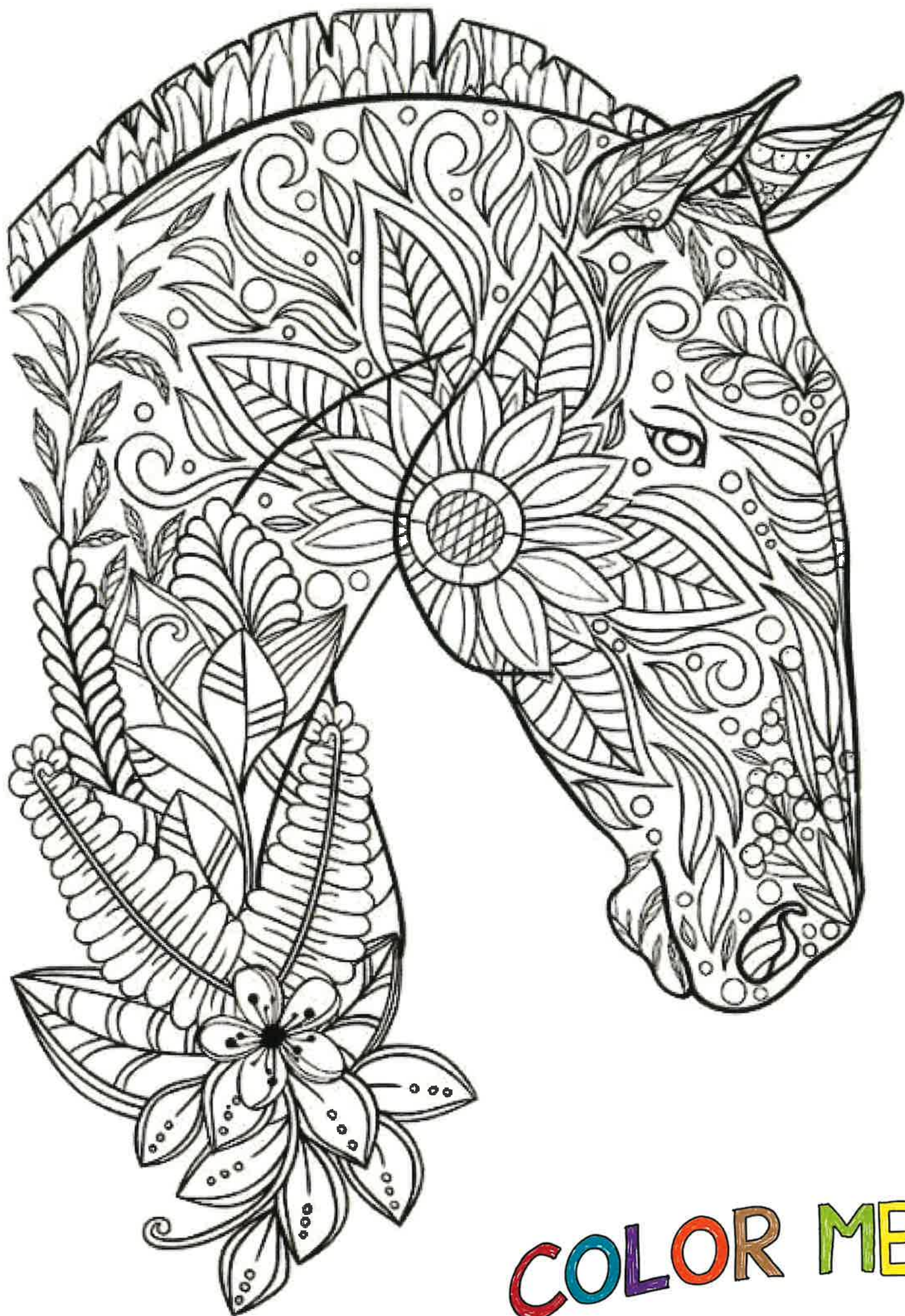
