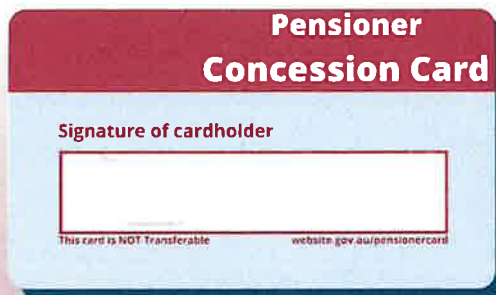
Alma Vickery Room - Wednesday 2nd April 1.30 pm

Previous meeting read and passed, seconded by J. Humphries

Business arising from previous meeting:

- Salted meals have been generally well-received, and regarded as an improvement, though some residents would prefer more salt still to be used during cooking process.
- False staff duress activation incidents reduced, to the relief of all.
- Moisturisation still an issue, DON Amanda Lee to bring up at next leadership meeting.
- Final touches to gazebo being added, finishing up the paint job and fixing remaining safety hazards.

General Business:

01: Fire System/Resident Fire Training: Malcolm outlines and answers questions about the fire safety system in place at Edgarley, allaying fears about the sprinklers and assuring residents that staff are well-trained in fire evacuation procedure as a requirement for working at the facility, with said training being refreshed on a yearly basis. Residents themselves then expressed interest in training, leading to the organisation of a special fire-training session for residents being held soon in the Alma Vickery Room by both Malcolm Hill and Michelle Parry-Hill.

All interested residents welcomed and encouraged to attend.

02: Maggie Beer Taste Testing Day: As many residents consider meals at Edgarley to be rather ordinary and unexciting, Maggie Beer once again brought up as a possible solution. Similar to last year's steak-tasting day, DON Amanda Lee proposes a Maggie Beer taste-testing day, with staff closely following the reception of the food and with discussion going on from there.

03: Bus Trip Safety: Due to an incident occurring on a leisure and lifestyle bus trip last month, management considering possibility of mandating an extra car and nurse to come along with every bus trip. This plan is still in early development.

04: Flu Vaccination: Flu inoculation shots for both residents and staff coming up for this year, exact date still to be announced.

05: Ladies Auxiliary: Ladies Auxiliary has kindly donated money for sprinklers that, noticing that the lawns have been very dry recently and that the residents would enjoy lovely green grass throughout the year.

06: Kevin Sporer: Kevin Sporer concert announced for Friday the 7th. Residents very excited for another Sporer performance.

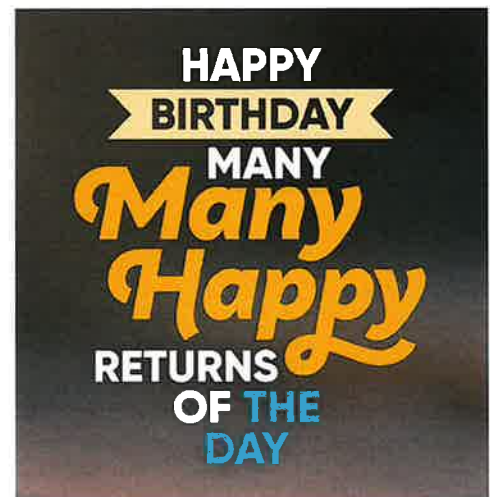

I was also very happy when my father returned from the war.

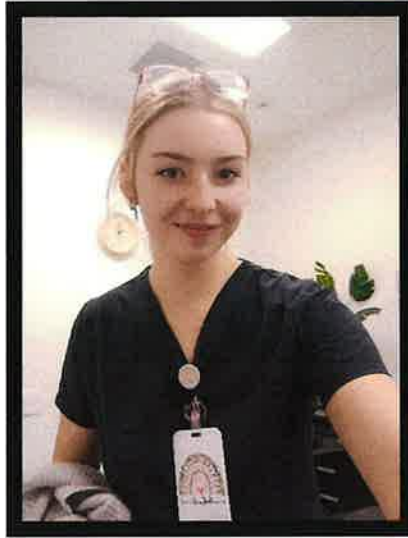
Who is your hero or the person you most admire? My mother and father but they have passed away now.

To reunite with loved ones, with hugs and joyful tears.

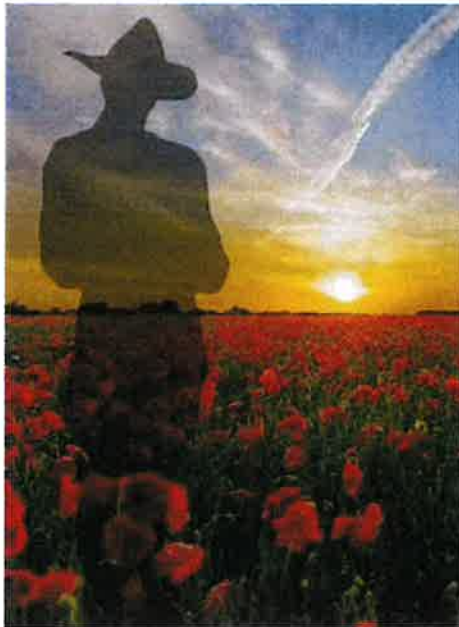
Let's join together, young and old, to honour them one and all,

To bow our heads in reverence as the "Ode of Remembrance" they say,

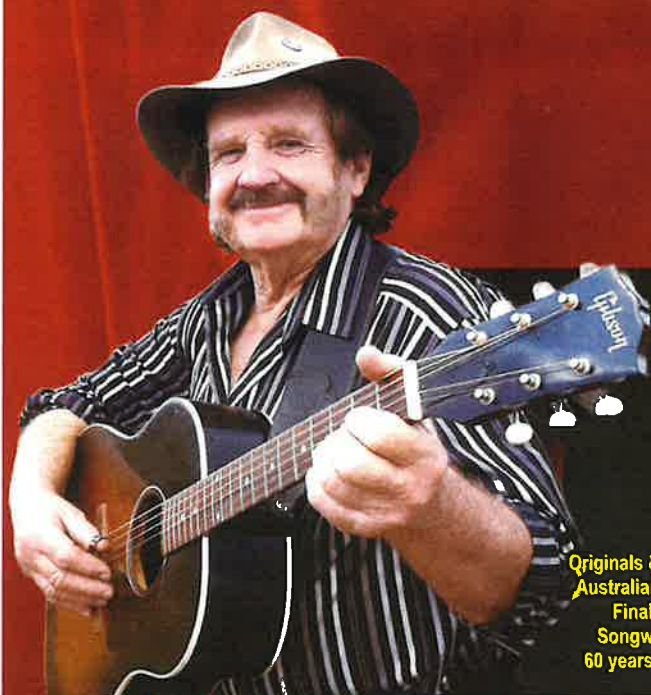

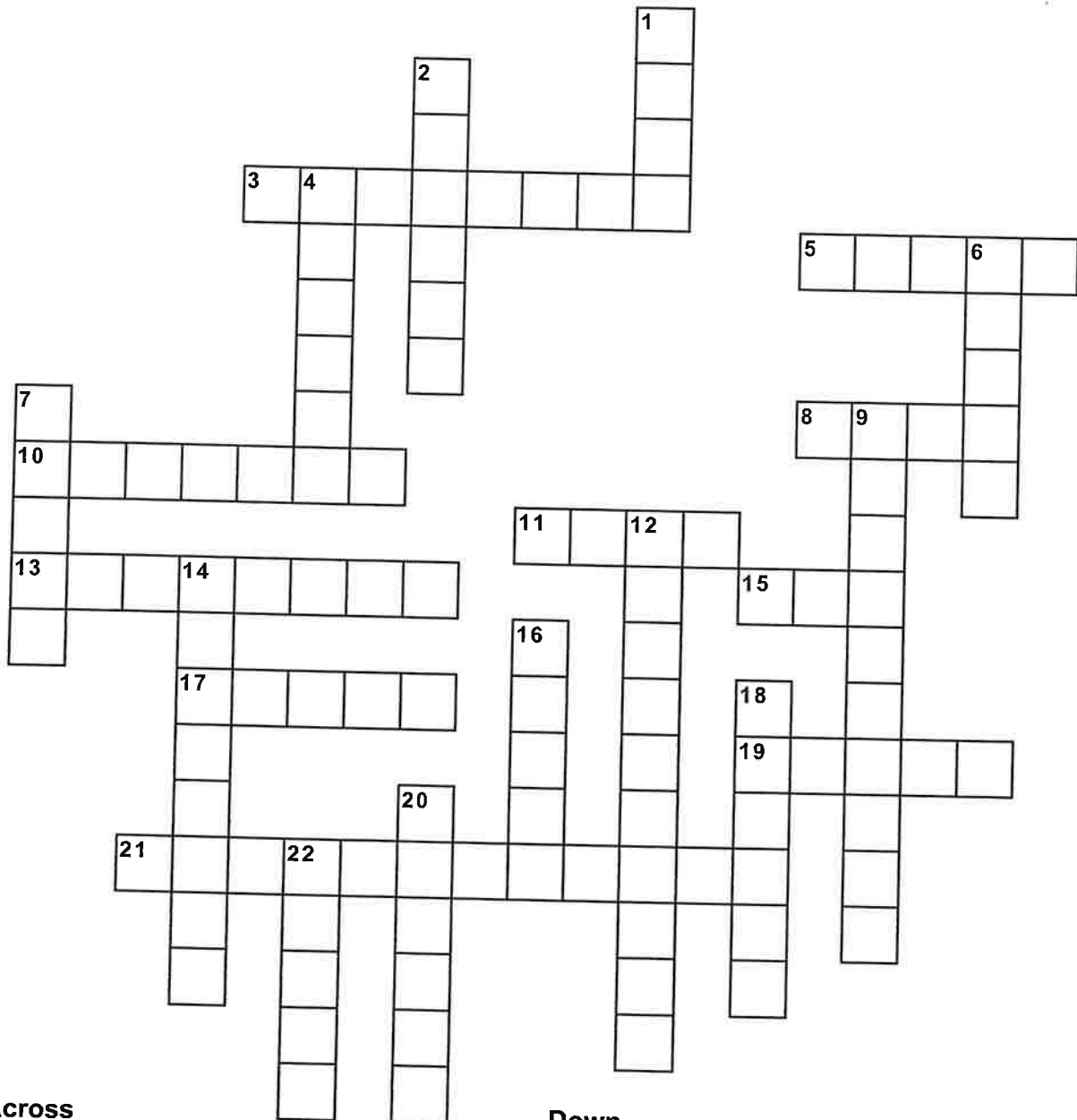
