## **Residents meeting**

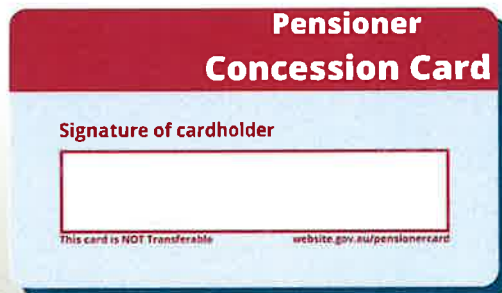

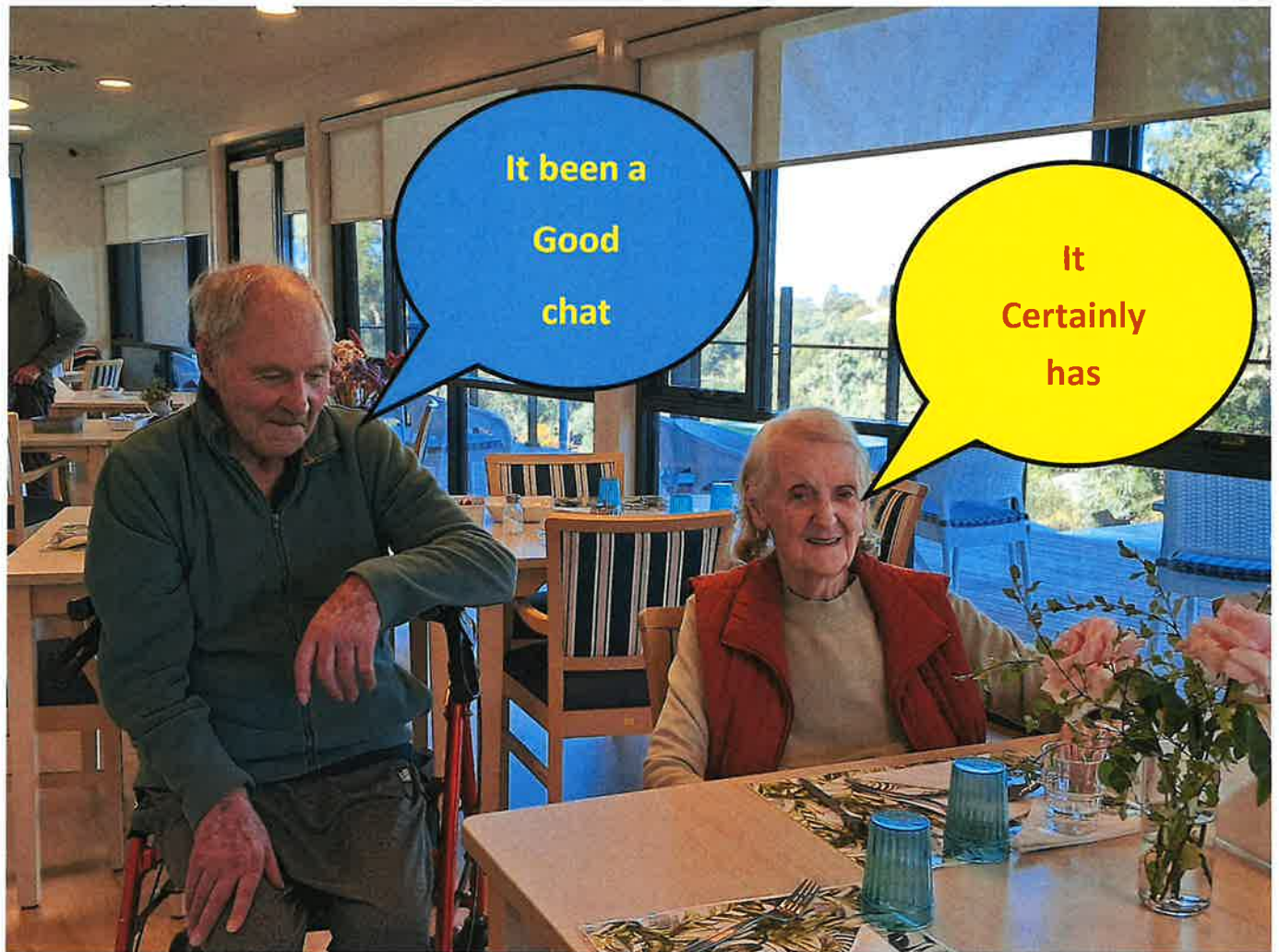

**What do you think is the most important thing in life?** Family.

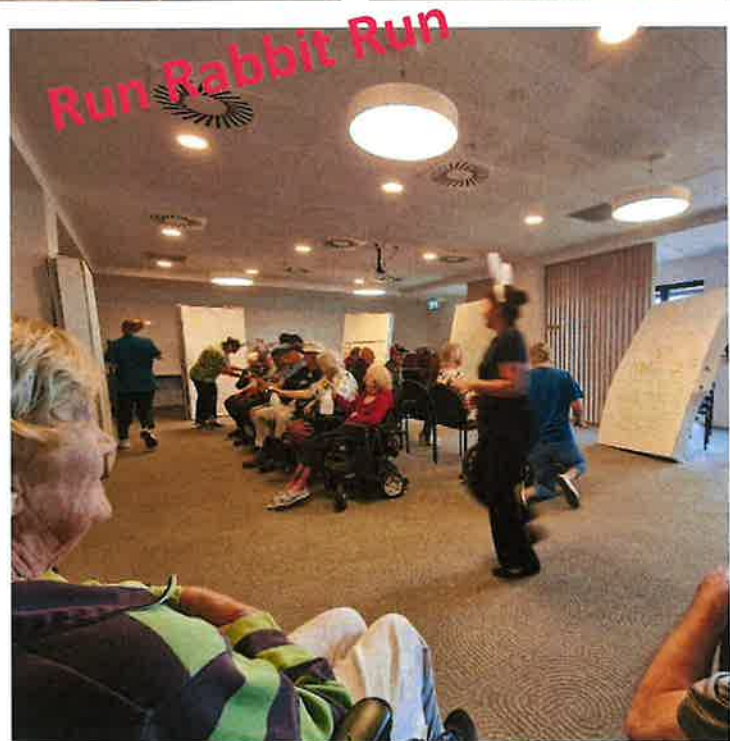

**RESIDENT'S MEETING**  
**April 2nd 2025**

**Meeting begins at 1:36 PM**

**Previous meeting read and passed, seconded by R. Jordan**

**Business arising from previous meeting:**

- Kitchen encouraged to continue to salt meals, increase salt amount incrementally.
- Maggie Beer taste-testing day in early planning stages, both date and menus TBA.
- Residents Gillian Brooke and John Humphries took part in recent staff fire training exercise, and found the experience helpful and educational. Malcolm Hill and Michelle Parry-Hill still organising fire safety training for residents, will announce date when ready.
- Edgar Medical House has not received influenza inoculations. Flu shots will be given when they arrive.
- New bus safety checks implemented. Before every trip, Leisure and Lifestyle is to make various checks to ensure maximum safety during the outing. These checks include things such as a first aid kit check, a water check, seatbelt check, etc. Leisure and Lifestyle, in tandem with nurses, will also be making sure that each resident is fit and healthy enough to go on the trip beforehand.

**General Business:**

**01: Salt and Pepper:** Residents comment on the lack of available salt and pepper shakers during meal times, noting that staff often take them to residents eating their meals in their rooms, and do not return them. DON Mandy Lee and kitchen staff member Lean Hornibrook tentatively discuss new system in which those residents who choose to eat their meals in their bedrooms will be given specially-coloured salt and pepper sashays, so that shakers will remain always on the table for residents.

**02: Staff Ratio:** Resident had some issues with residents to staff ratio, with Mandy allaying these concerns, explaining that ratio is the best it's been in 30 years, with 2 care staff per resident, one RN on for every shift, and an EN on staff for most shifts, numbers that are superior to many places even in Melbourne.

**03: Podiatrist:** Some residents express concern that they do not see the podiatrist enough, feeling that they would benefit from more frequent visitations. The schedule is at the discretion of the podiatrist, though residents are encouraged to speak up if they feel the need to see her. DON Mandy Lee floats idea of asking podiatrist to come in twice a month, instead of just once.

**04: Voting:** Early voting is again coming to Edgarley, held in the Alma Vickery Room on the 29<sup>th</sup> of April, from 10.00 AM to 12.00 PM. Pamphlets for the various political options will be made available to guide and bolster residents in their voting choices. Voting for staff also provided, though not until all residents have been accounted for. DON Mandy Lee looking into how this process will be handled for those registered to vote originally from other electorates.

**05: Pests:** Residents report seeing pests around facility recently, most notably wasps and ants. Residents told to report infestations on sight so that pest control may be contacted immediately. Mandy also considers installing flywire doors on all patio doors if possible.

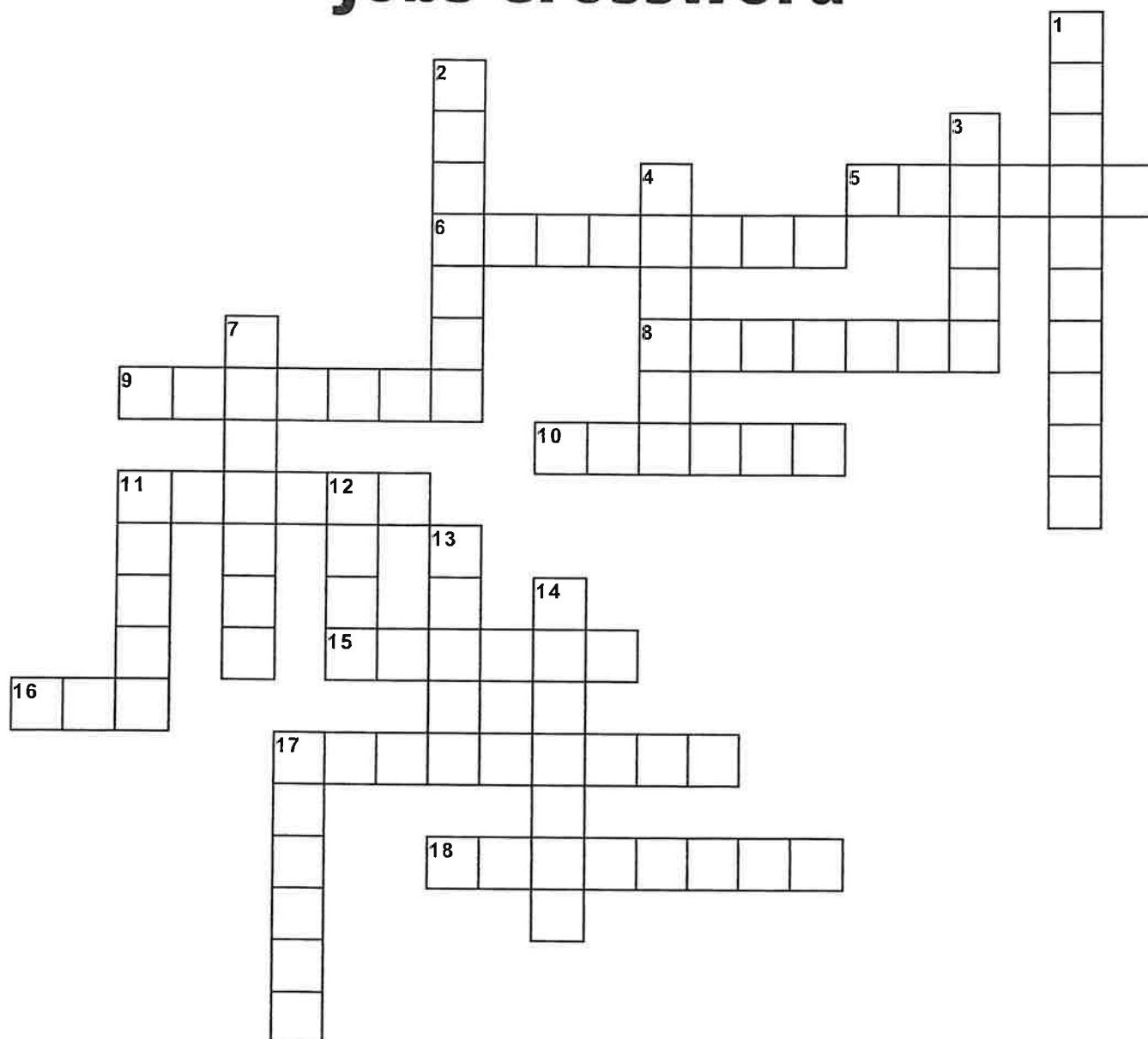

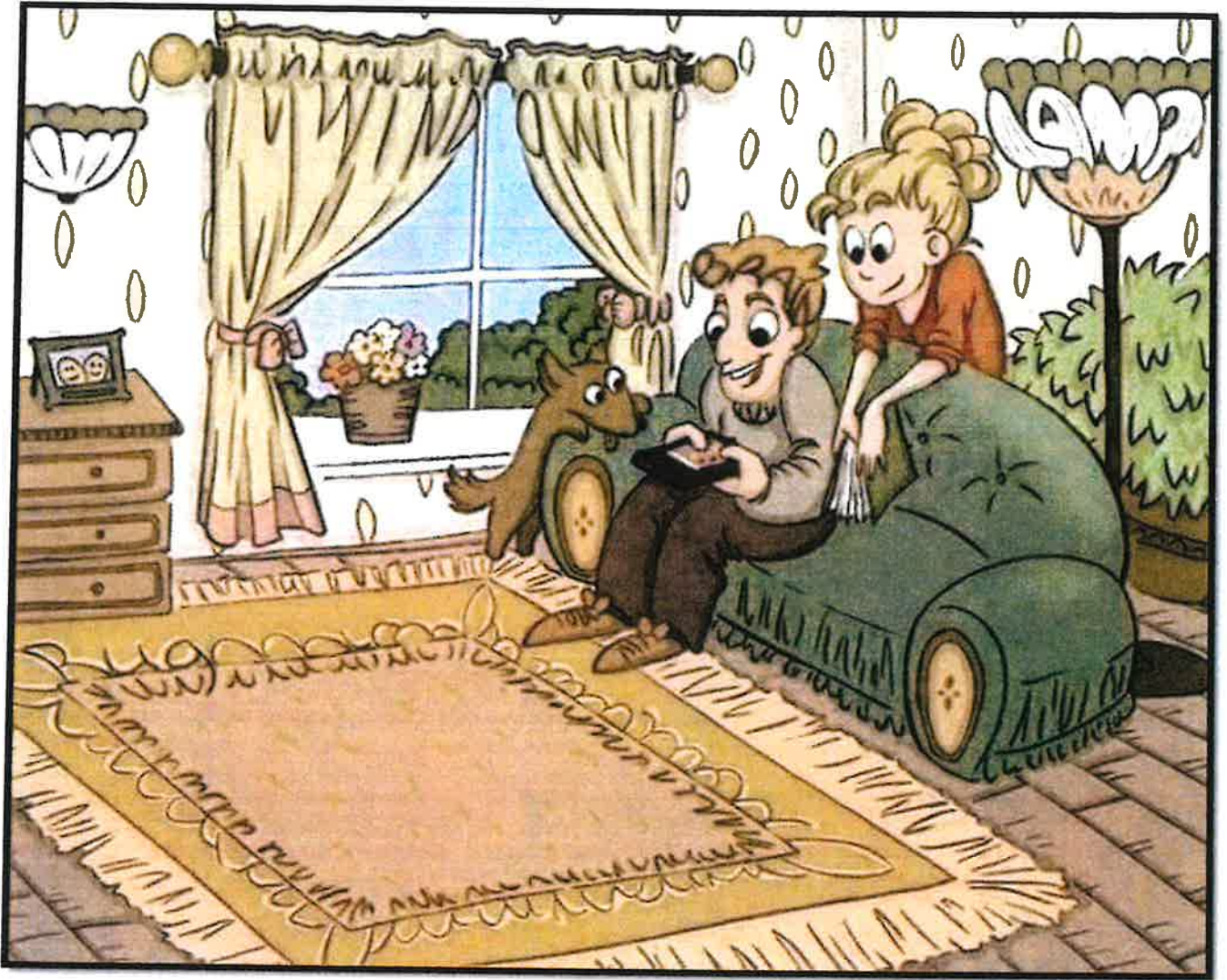

## Star Wars Day

4<sup>th</sup> May



In a Galaxy Far, Far Away.....

May the fourth has become Star Wars Day for its close resemblance to the catch phrase, “May the force be with you”. Ronald Reagan even called his Strategic Defence Program “Star Wars”. In 1979, Margaret Thatcher’s political party in Britain was the first to coin the phrase “May the Fourth be with You” to congratulate her on her win on the 4<sup>th</sup> May 1979.

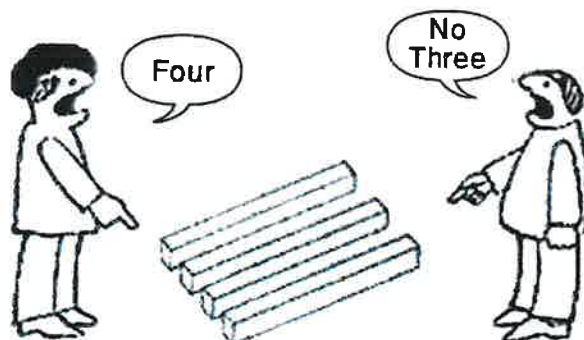

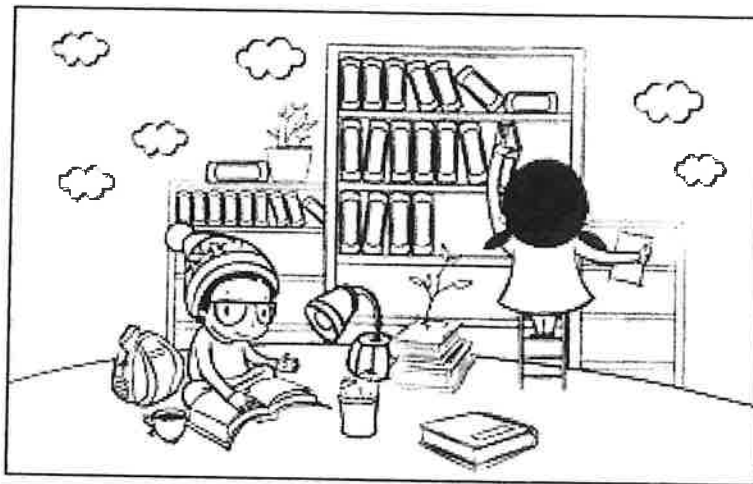

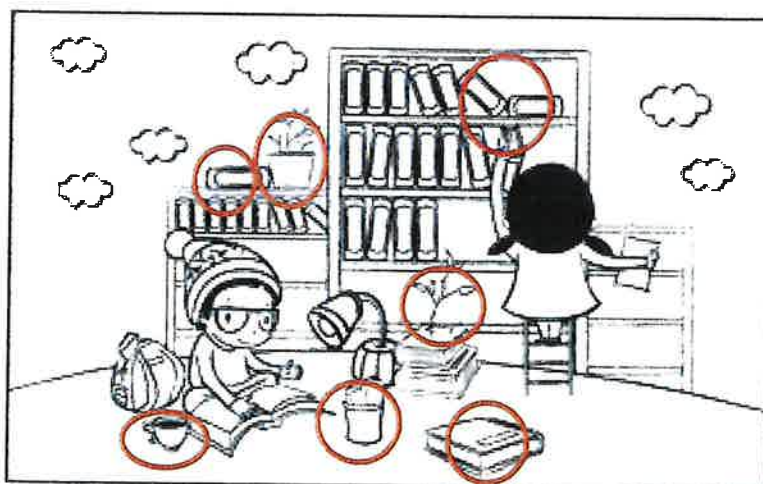
