Independent Living Units Update:

To ILU Residents,

I am happy to announce that the work on the external repairs will begin soon. The Insurance Building Contractors have been on site the last couple of weeks obtaining measurements.

On July 4th we will be holding a Book Launch on the History of Edgarley to which an invitation has been given to you all.

We have been informed that the Aged Care Reforms are now not due to be implemented until 1^{st} November 2025.

We are still waiting on the Grant Submission result – we should hear mid to late July if we were successful. If we are successful with the Grant, then we will have a number of meetings for the planning process, and how the build will impact on any existing residents. There will not be any buildings demolished until sometime in 2026 to make way for the new build. Please be assured that there will be many opportunities for residents to have their input into the process ahead. If we are unsuccessful then we may ask for a payout of the repairs for the buildings that are vacant and damaged from the storm to which we may demolish them and just build a couple of new community/ activity areas. Again there will be opportunity for residents to have a say in the process, no actual work to be carried out until 2026.

The next ILU residents meeting will be in August, date to be advised.



- Win the game if you're the last person with chips in front of them.









RESIDENT'S MEETING May 7th 2025

Meeting begins at 1:38 PM Previous meeting read and passed, seconded by D. Fletcher

Business arising from previous meeting:

- Maggie Beer meals still in the pipeline, though starting date still unknown.
- Residents very pleased with new male podiatrist, office trying to book him for more sessions if possible.
- Enough interested residents/staff have been booked for the Mobile Dental Clinic Australia to come down from Melbourne and offer their services. Date TBA.
- Mother's Day High Tea considered a success last year's turnout was beaten by a whopping 37 guests. Residents thank staff for their help during the high tea.

General Business:

01: Elder Rights: Julie from Elder Rights Australia opens the meeting by outlining their residents rights to them (right to respect, right to have their culture and identity respected, right to live free of abuse, etc), and how if they ever feel their rights and needs are not being met, that they are free to call ERA at any time and explain their feelings.

A. Lee informs residents that the ERA number (1800 700 600) is always freely available from the front office, and found also in pamphlets near the same. Julie then gives Leisure and Lifestyle brochures to hand out, and kindly thanks the residents for their time.

02: Resident's Experience Survey: A video is played on the widescreen, making residents aware of an upcoming out-of-house Resident's Experience Survey that aims to find out what residents *like* and *dislike* about aged care life. The survey consists of 14 questions, takes approximately 10-30 minutes to complete, is anonymous, and will be done by residents selected at random for the sake of impartiality.

03: Bird Feeders: Lez reveals plans to purchase bird feeders for the balconies on both floors, but admits he is having trouble finding the right kind. A feeder that is too open will cause mess and attract pests. There is controversy around the idea of bird feeders at all — some residents feel that they make wild birds lazy and complacent, others however would like to feed their feathered friends. For now, the discussion is put on hold.

04: Microphone: Since Residents Meetings have moved downstairs into the Alma Vickery Room some residents have found it difficult to hear the discussions, with one resident asked if the seating arrangement made more compact so that all could hear.

Mandy Lee also suggests the purchasing of a microphone to make things easier to hear.

05: In Memory Of: The Mackie family has donated two roses in the name of Ian Mackie and Lorna Mackie, both of whom are now deceased. May they rest in peace.

Residents also invited to the funeral service if they wish to attend.

06: Activity Announcement: At some point in the future daily activities will be announced over the PA system, so that all residents are reminded of what is happening, when it is happening, and where.

07: Food: Two residents request a personal chat with cook Leanne Hornibrook regarding their meals. Leisure and Lifestyle to pass word on to kitchen.
