

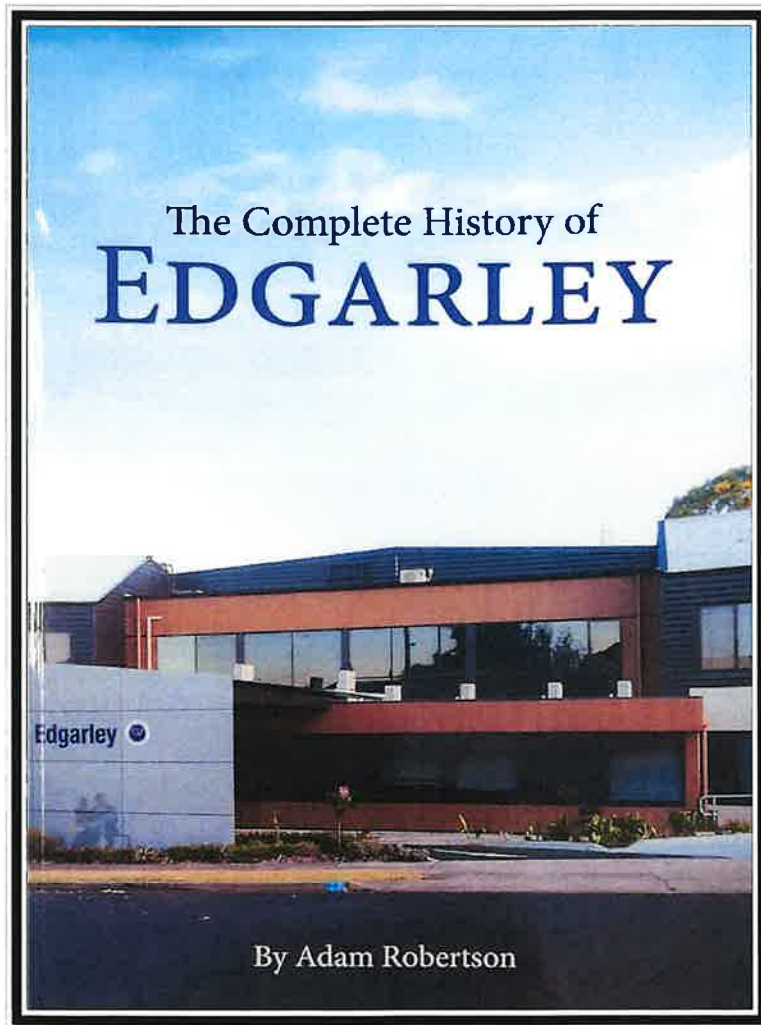

From the CEO



Hi Everyone,

There is much to report and inform you regarding the upcoming months, firstly an update on the Storm repairs: - There are fortnightly meetings with management discussing the progress and commencement of the external repairs. Single story buildings will be first - Jackson Street and Edgarley Court will have their roofs and external Air Conditioning Units replaced. Repairs to commence in September to Edgarley Court Units 7-12.

Casterton Hospital Merger with WDHS: The Hospital has announced a possible merger with Western District Health Services. Several community meetings have been held to date for the community to discuss this. The last meeting was held in June 2025. Since this meeting there has been a change of Board personnel with the Chair Greg Hart stepping down and Dr Jennifer James taking over. The community is still waiting on a decision to be made public. There was a Board meeting on the 21st August 2025, so a decision I expect will be forthcoming.

The History Book Launch went well, with Author Adam Robertson being excited about the book being completed. Nancy Robertson attended the Launch and is a very proud grandmother given Adam's achievement. Books are available for purchase for \$25 at the Edgarley Reception.

On the 2nd and 3rd of September, I will be presenting at a Aged Care Leaders Forum in Melbourne and then on the 24th until the 27th September Mandy, Trish and I will be at an International Advanced Care Planning Conference in Queensland, where again I will be presenting a Digital presentation.

In October I will be away for a surgical procedure and then will be working off site during the recovery period. Please contact the office for any reason whilst I am away. Lastly, in October we will be having Staff dress up for Halloween, which will be lots of fun for everyone.

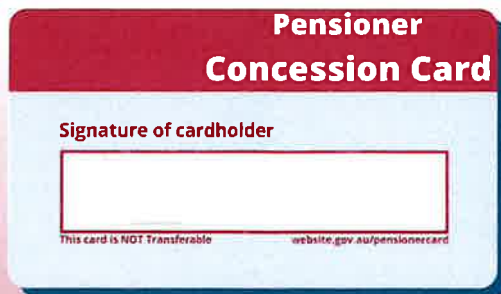
Alma Vickery Room - Wednesday 3rd September 1.30pm

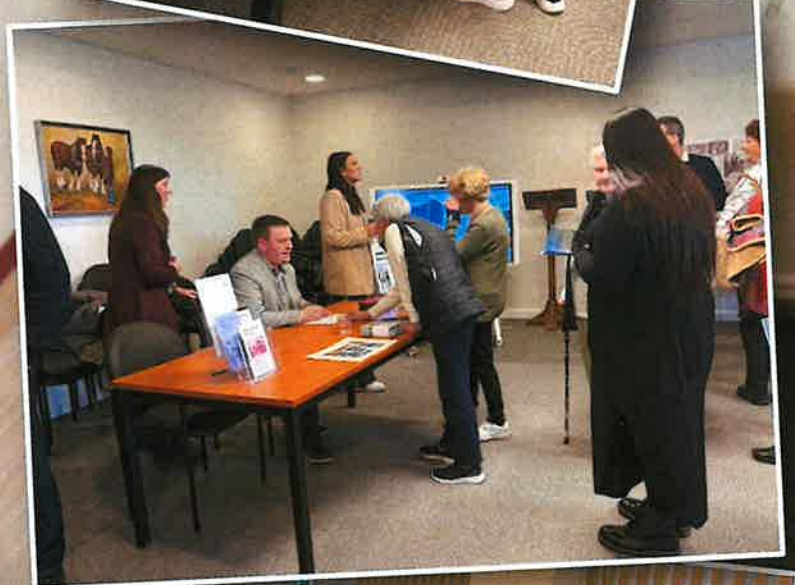


EDGARLEY BOOK LAUNCH

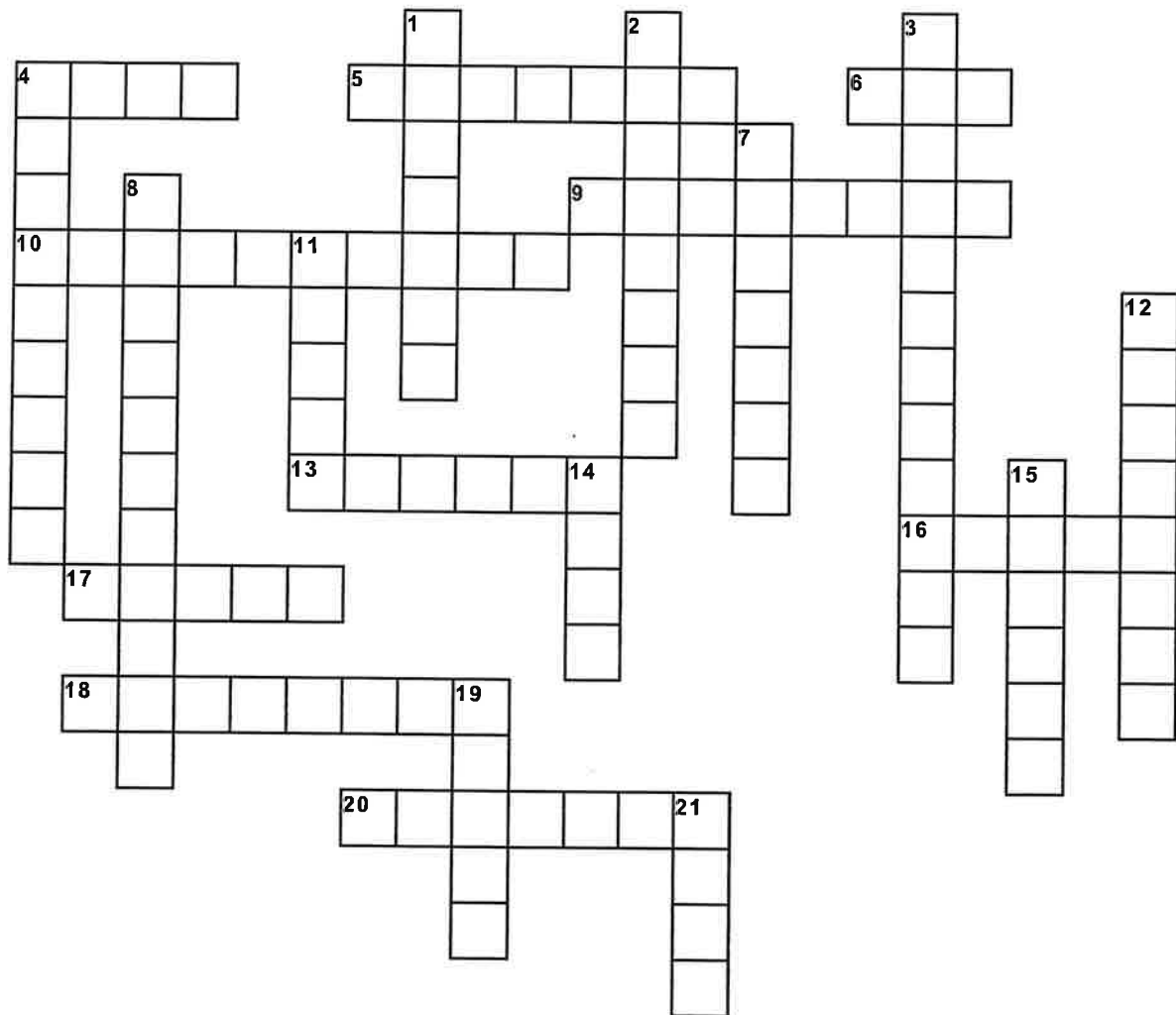

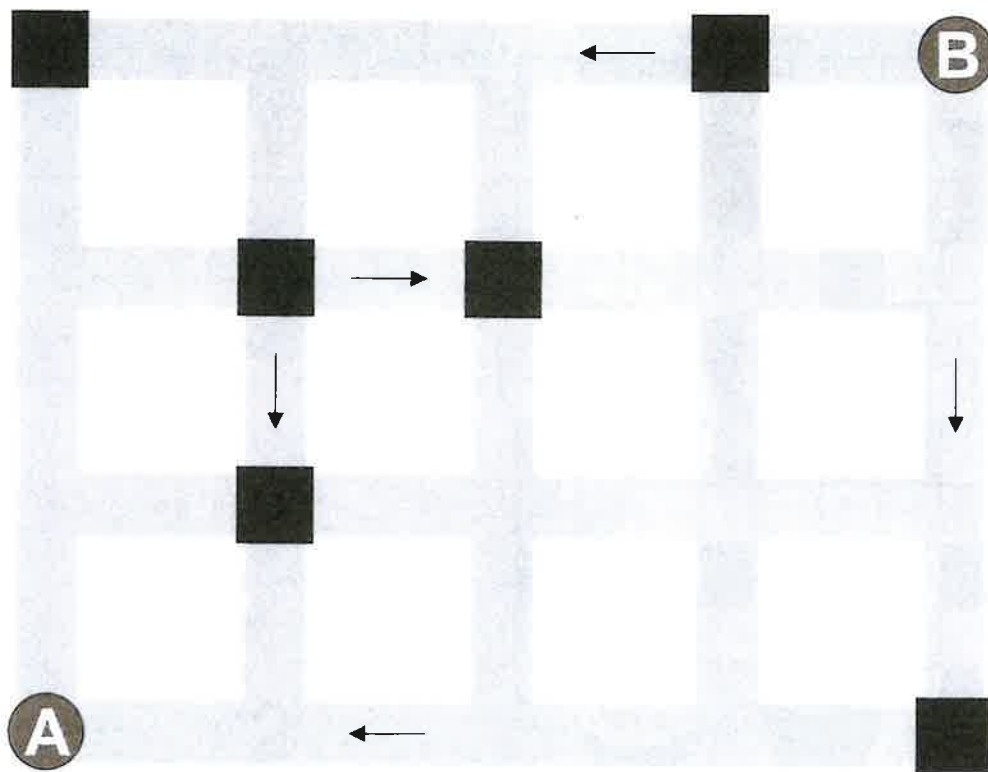

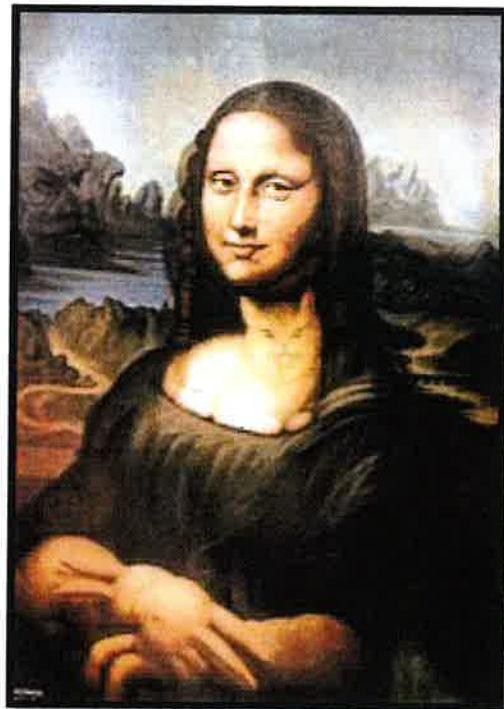
