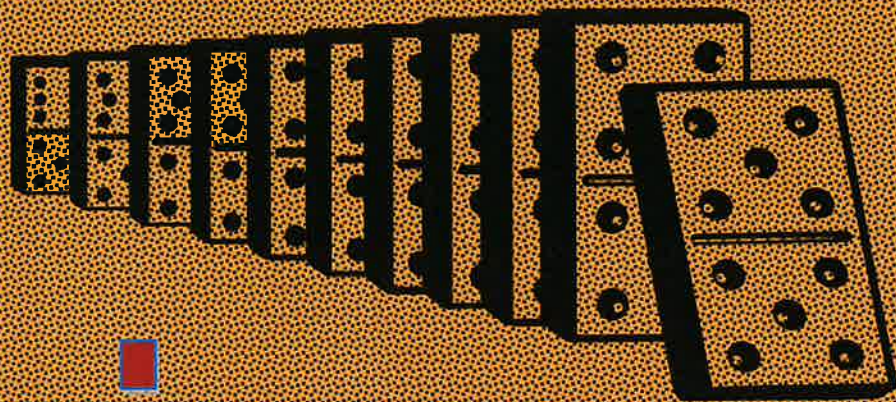
Interviewer: Anything the residents and staff should be aware of?

Resident Clothing Policy

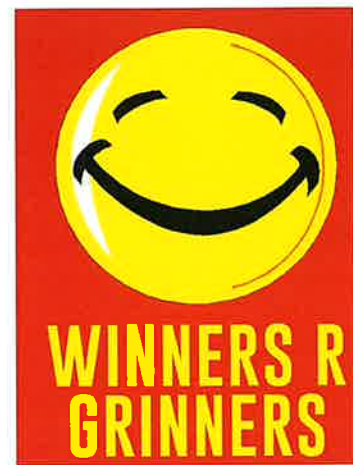
