*If a resident schedules an appointment on their own, they are responsible for arranging their own transportation. However, if they would like staff to provide transportation, the facility will handle the arrangements.*



This morning, our residents were absolutely delighted to welcome the students and teachers from Sacred Heart Primary School.







On Christmas morning, residents woke to the festive chime of bells and the magic of Santa delivering gifts for everyone to enjoy.



**What do you think is the most important thing in life?** Honesty


