From the CEO



Hi Everyone,

Well the year has definitely started with a bang. I can not believe we are coming to the end of February already. I feel like I went to sleep on Christmas Day and woke up at the end of February.

Work has commenced on the residential home with scaffolding going up around the building. Please be careful around the building as the scaffolding will move around the building in stages.

There are a number of things happening around the home: Edgarley successfully completed the NDIS mid term registration Audit in January. We have also completed a Menu Review Audit and a Prudential Standards Audit conducted by the Department of Health, Ageing and Disability in January/February 2026.

Other events coming up: Registered Nurses and Enrolled Nurses will be completing off site 3-day Comprehensive Assessment of the Older person course staggered over the year. Senior management team members will also be attending offsite management training and attending conferences on Aged Care and other relevant topics.

- **English is not the first language of Ireland.**
- **Irish, also known as Gaelic is the official language of Ireland.**
- **Ireland is known as the Emerald Isle because of how green it is.**
- **St. Patrick was born in Wales, not in Ireland.**
- **More Irish people are living abroad than there are in Ireland.**
- **There are 80 million Irish people outside of Ireland and only around 5 million in Ireland.**
- **Half of the entire population of Australia claim Irish ancestry.**
- **The Titanic was built by 15,000 Irishmen in Belfast, Northern Ireland.**
- **The Wild Atlantic Way, a stunning drive that stretches 2,500 km (1,600 miles) is the longest coastal driving route in the world.**
- **The official National Symbol of Ireland is the harp, although the shamrock and the Celtic cross are also well known symbols.**
- **80% of Ireland's people are Roman Catholic.**
- **Ireland has won the Eurovision Song Festival seven times, more than any other country.**
- **The Irish potato famine of the 1840's decimated the population of Ireland. By the time it ended, roughly one million Irish had died and another million had left their homeland as refugees.**

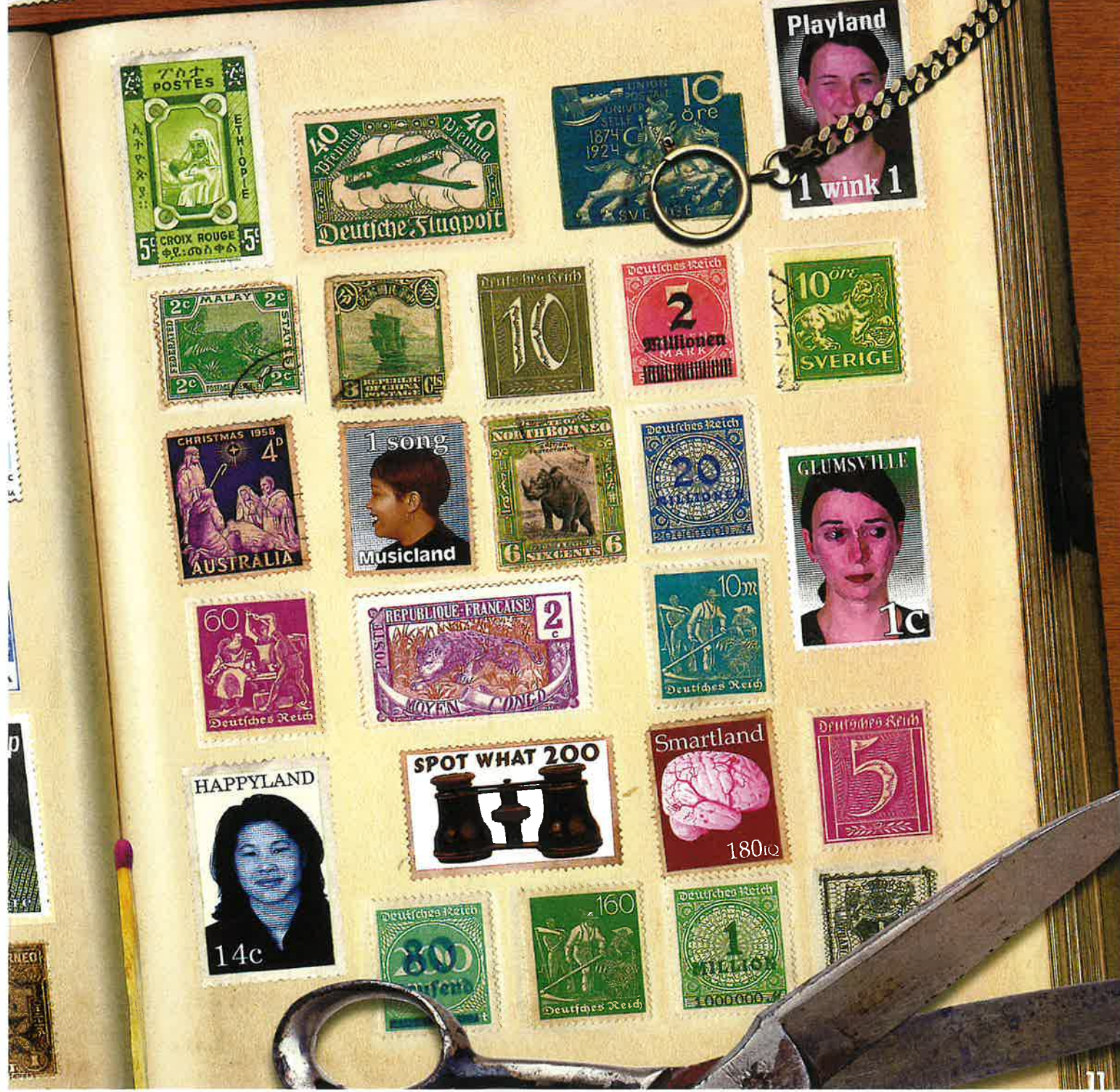

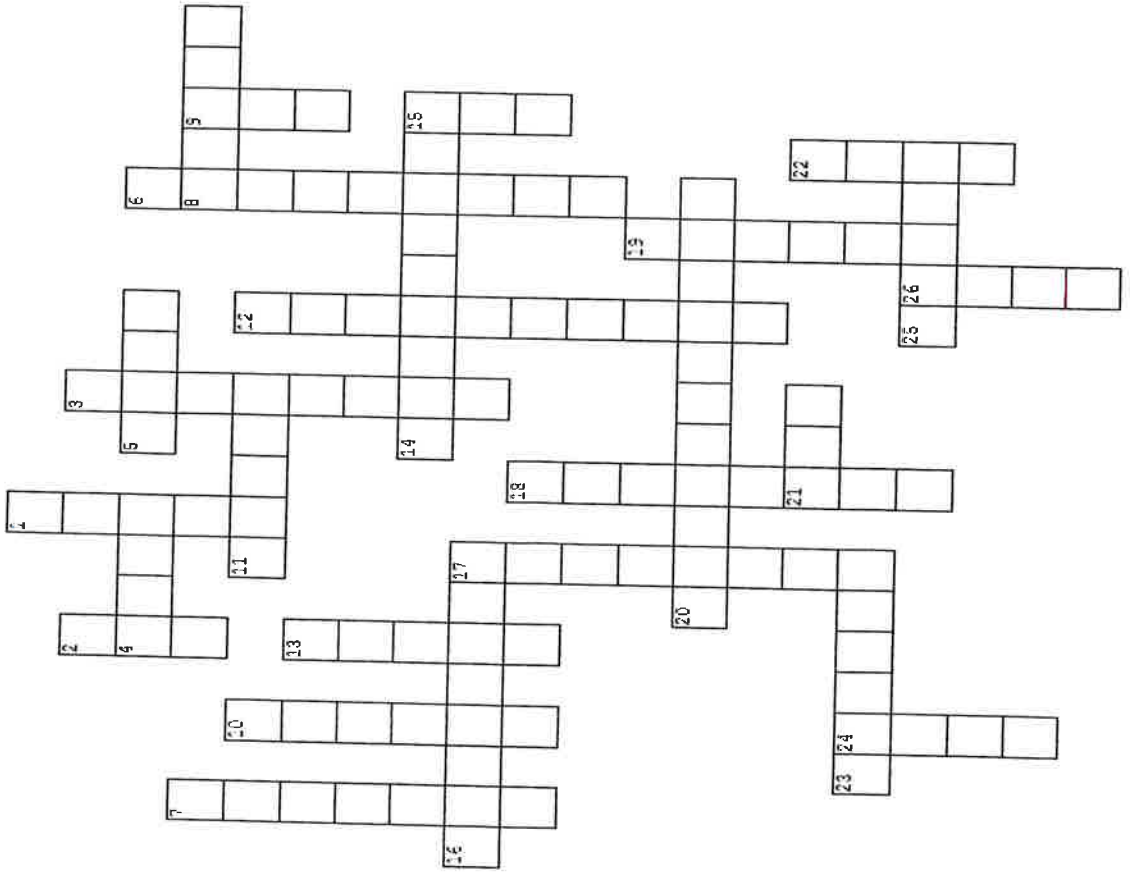
