Anzac Day, held annually on April 25th, is a national day of remembrance in Australia and New Zealand commemorating all who served and died in military operations. It marks the 1915 landing of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZACs) at Gallipoli. It is important because it honors the courage and sacrifice of over 103,000 Australians who died in conflict, fostering national reflection on our military history, values, and the impact of war.

## ANZAC DAY

At the dawn of April twenty-five in the year nineteen fifteen,  
Young men in khaki waited for a signal, battle keen.  
Before the day was over, they would carve their names in glory,  
And the Australian, New Zealand Army Corps, would begin the ANZAC story.

On Gallipoli Peninsula the Turkish army waited,  
Even the dawn of morning seemed to wait, with breath abated.  
With a final handshake for their mates the ANZACS headed in,  
No thoughts of losing this one, they were there to win.

The enemy shelled the ANZAC boats as through the surf they pounded,  
And the machine guns took their toll, here the first keel grounded.  
Finally, the ANZACS faced the enemy ahead,  
While patches of blue water slowly turned to red.

The enemy had strong defences, five divisions for their cause,  
But at the place called ANZAC COVE the young men did not pause.  
Pell-mell up the beach they ran and climbed the stony hill,  
And engaged enemy in battle, as only ANZACS will.

With the ridges now resounding to the din of Turkish guns,  
The ANZACS fought relentless, the fathers, brothers, sons.  
Three whole days they held their line, none allowed to rest,  
And the enemy began to realise they had taken on the best.

For days and months, the battle raged one against the other,  
When one campaign was finished so would start another.  
Heroic deeds are still recalled by the very few,  
Who are left to tell the story of the ANZACS, brave and true.

On Gallipoli Peninsula the battle sites still stand,

Where the ANZACS found their glory, in a strange and distant land.

Lone pine, Mortar Ridge, Russell's Top and Battleship Hill,  
Once scenes of mortal combat are quiet now and still.

It has been said t'was all a mistake, with nothing much to gain,

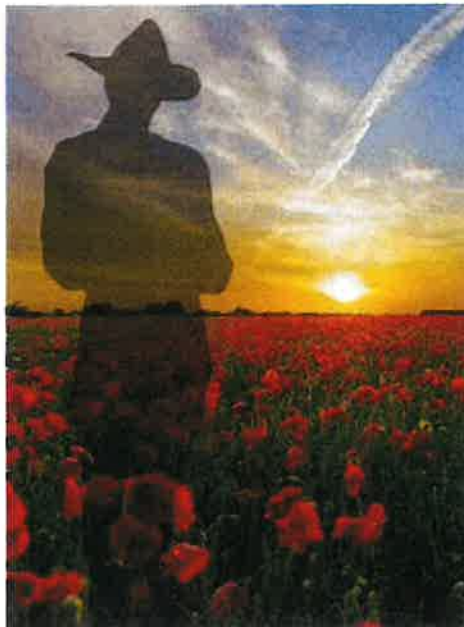
But the story of the ANZACS always will remain.  
As a monument of courage and the price of peace,  
A reminder that our vigilance must never cease.

The freedom we enjoy today is due to the sacrifice,  
Of all the ANZACS in all the wars who paid the maximum price.

And to those who came back from those fateful years,  
To reunite with loved ones, with hugs and joyful tears.

Let's join together, young and old, to honour them one and all,  
And stand with pride as we listen to that "Last Post" bugle call.  
To bow our heads in reverence as the "Ode of Remembrance" they say,  
On the 25<sup>th</sup> of April, Australia's ANZAC DAY.
