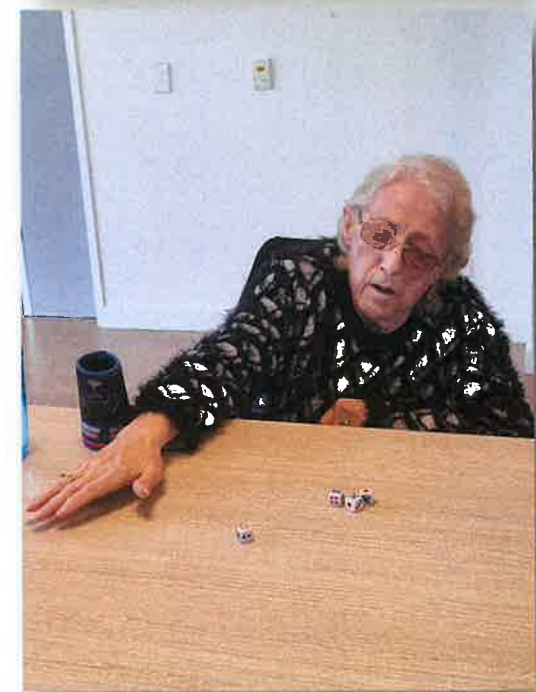

The Statement of Rights

The Statement of Rights clearly identifies your rights when seeking or receiving aged care services. Under the Aged Care Act 2024, your provider and aged care workers are legally obliged to deliver services in line with these rights.



Autonomy and freedom of choice

I have the right to make my own choices – about my care, relationships, lifestyle and taking risks – with support if I want it.



Equitable access

I have the right to have my needs assessed in a way that works for me including having my cultural background, past trauma or cognitive conditions, such as dementia, respected.



Safe, quality care

I have the right to be treated with dignity and respect by experienced aged care workers who value my identity, culture, spirituality and diversity.



Privacy and confidentiality

I must have my privacy respected and my personal information kept confidential, and be in control of who this information is shared with.



Communication and complaints

I have the right to be informed in a way I understand and to raise concerns without fear of reprisal. My feedback must be dealt with fairly and promptly.



Support and social connections

I can stay connected to important people, pets and culture including independent advocates. As an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander I can stay connected to Country and Island Home.

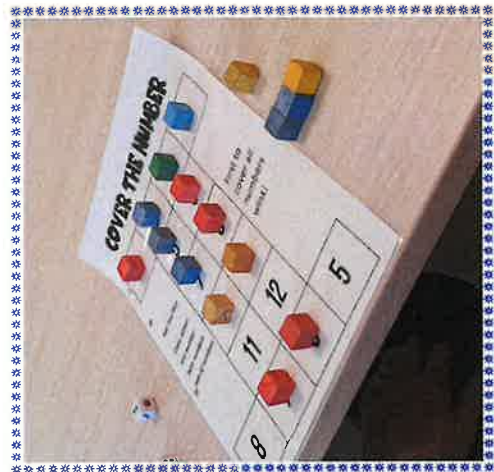
Having Fun & Staying Connected!

Residents Learn About Visionflex Technology

During this month's Residents' Meeting, residents had the opportunity to learn about the VisionFlex system through an informative presentation delivered by RN Raelene.

Residents were shown how the VisionFlex equipment works and how it can be used to support telehealth appointments, allowing residents to connect with doctors, specialists, dentists and other healthcare professionals via secure video consultations.

The presentation generated plenty of interest, with residents engaging in discussion about how the technology could be used within the facility. Topics included accessing healthcare providers located outside the local area, maintaining privacy and confidentiality during appointments, having family members or staff present for support if desired, and reducing the need to travel for certain healthcare consultations.

Residents appreciated the opportunity to see the equipment demonstrated firsthand and learn more about how telehealth services can improve access to healthcare while remaining in the comfort of the facility. Many residents expressed interest in the service and the benefits it may offer in the future.

A big thank you to RN Raelene for taking the time to demonstrate the VisionFlex system, answer questions and provide residents with an engaging and informative presentation.



CHANGE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Over the last six weeks several staff from across the facility have attended training with the Primary Health Network & Thrive Aged Care Consultants.

During the training, staff engaged in the process of improving the knowledge and use of the Telehealth/ Vision flex cart. The staff involved in the training developed a couple of ideas to drive this improvement.

At last month's residents meeting, Raelene RN/ clinical lead demonstrated the telehealth cart to the residents, this enabled residents to see firsthand the features and advantages of the cart.

This was received with positive feedback from all that attended.

Residents also took part in a survey which was conducted by Sarah (leisure and lifestyle). The survey reflected the resident's knowledge and willingness to use the telehealth cart. Once again, the results were positive

The need for change was recognised as some residents were unable or would find it difficult to travel to specialist appointments.

Telehealth/ Vision flex offered an alternative way for residents to access health care services without the need to travel.

Tuesday 16th June 2026 Lynnette Killey and Michelle Parry-Hill represented Edgarley at the RACH Change Management Program, Celebration and Showcase in Ballarat. Edgarley were one of the seven facilities which presented their work.

It was a very interesting day listening to the other facilities present their work and achievements. Many excellent ideas were discussed and offered the opportunity to network with organisations within the aged Care sector.

At the end of the day all participants were able to take part in the people's choice award for the best presentation of the day. Unfortunately, Edgarley came second, missing out by just one vote (Lynnette and Michelle had voted for another facility, trying to be professional, they will not be doing that again). Edgarley were still presented with an achievement certificate.

A massive thank you to Sarah (leisure and lifestyle) for all her hard work and for assisting with the preparation of the presentation, (sadly Sarah was unable to attend on the day) her input was amazing.



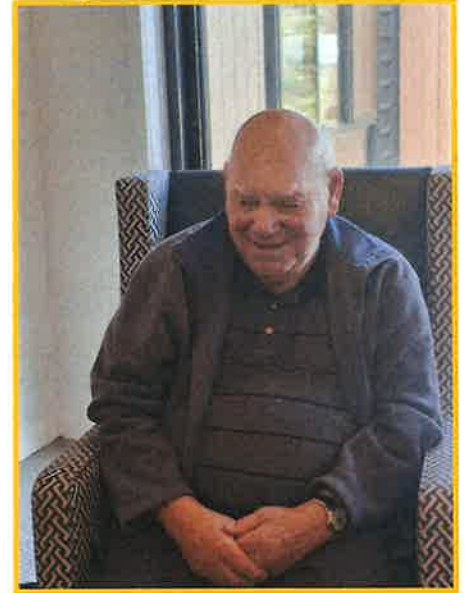
More Dominoes

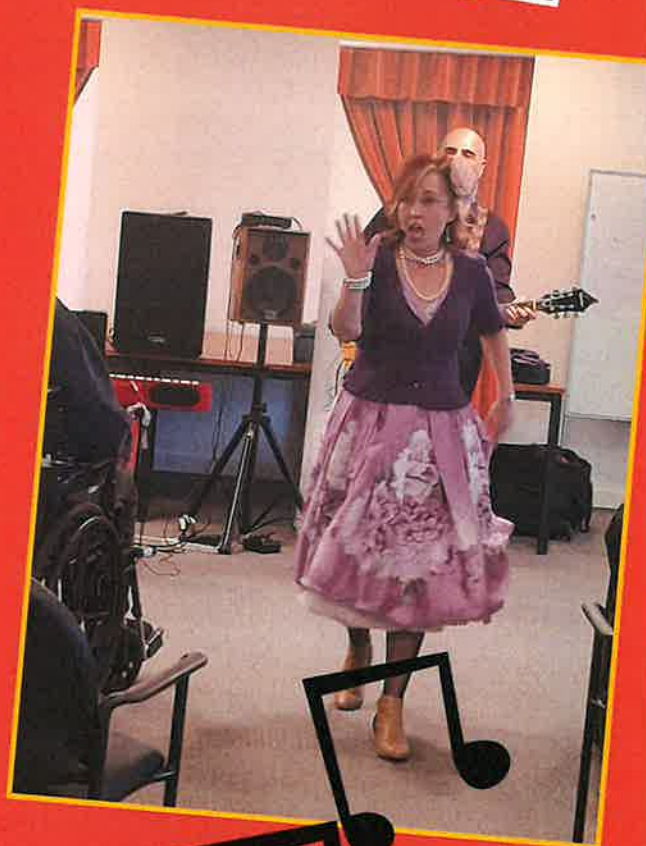
Our residents had a wonderful time down at the Dartmoore Pub, eating their fill of stroganoff, fish n' chips and salads, and promising to return again as soon as possible!

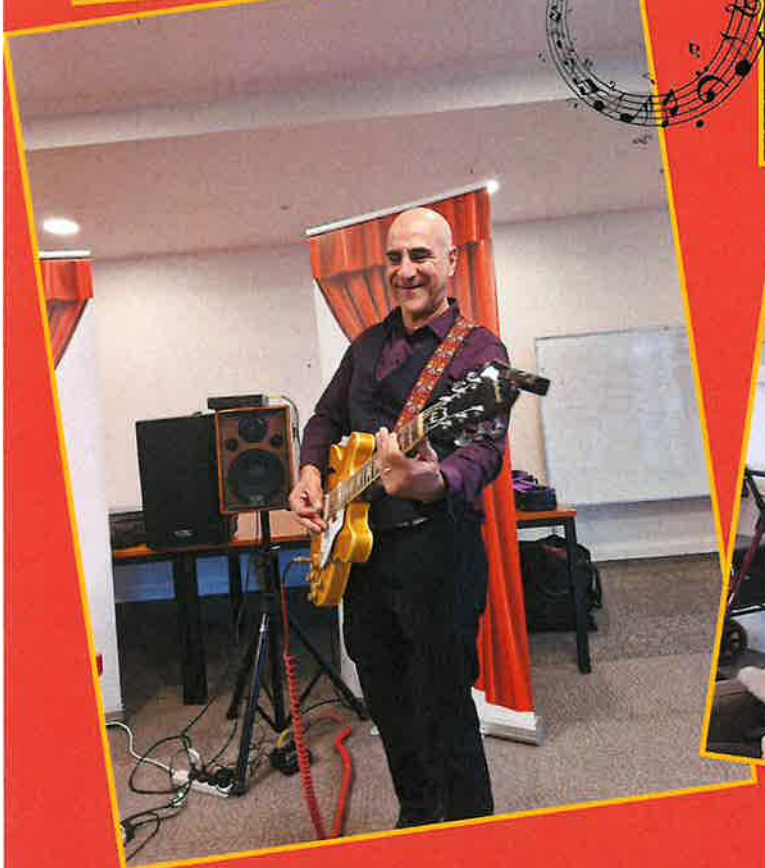


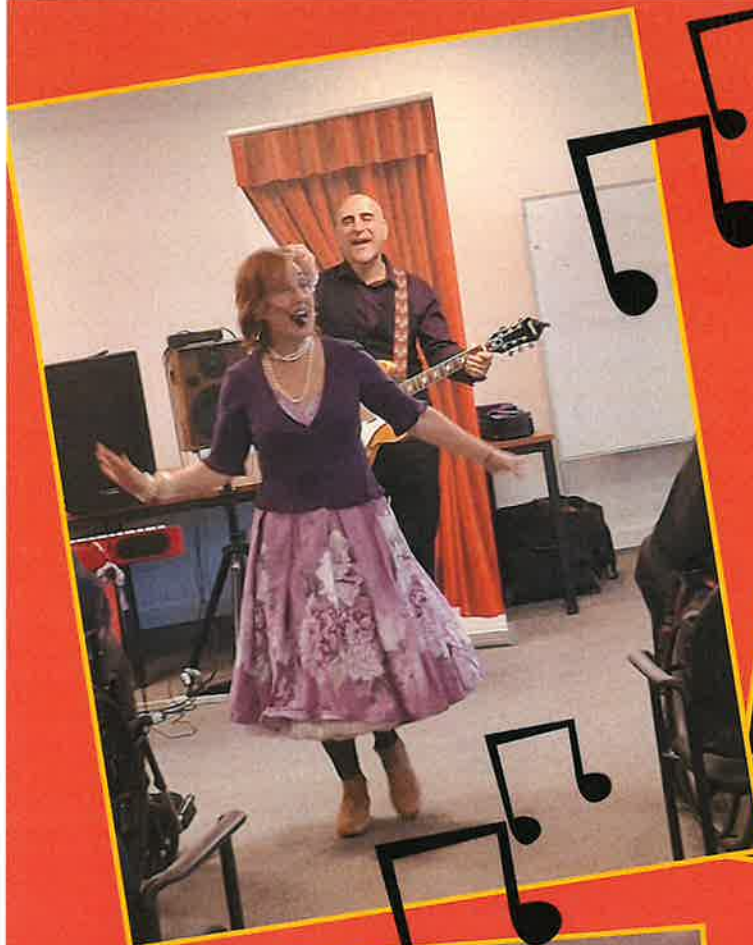

5.01 Tele Health

Raelene and Sarah introduce a new health-care system to and for the residents, Tele Health, via live demonstration. Tele Health is an online health service, where residents will be able to book appointments with a doctor of their choice, and be seen virtually over a computer. Privacy will be respected, with residents able to choose whether a staff member stays in the room for the appointment or not.

That the latest in health care advancements be made for the residents are Edgarley to further promote their health and well-being.

A resident says that they have actually used Tele Health before, and that it averted a stroke, and that she could not have been more happy with the service.

Raelene then expresses that the service is so comprehensive as to include connection with a device that is placed in the patient's mouth, allowing for dental health to be assessed. Many residents expressed interest in the service and the benefits it may offer in the future.
