

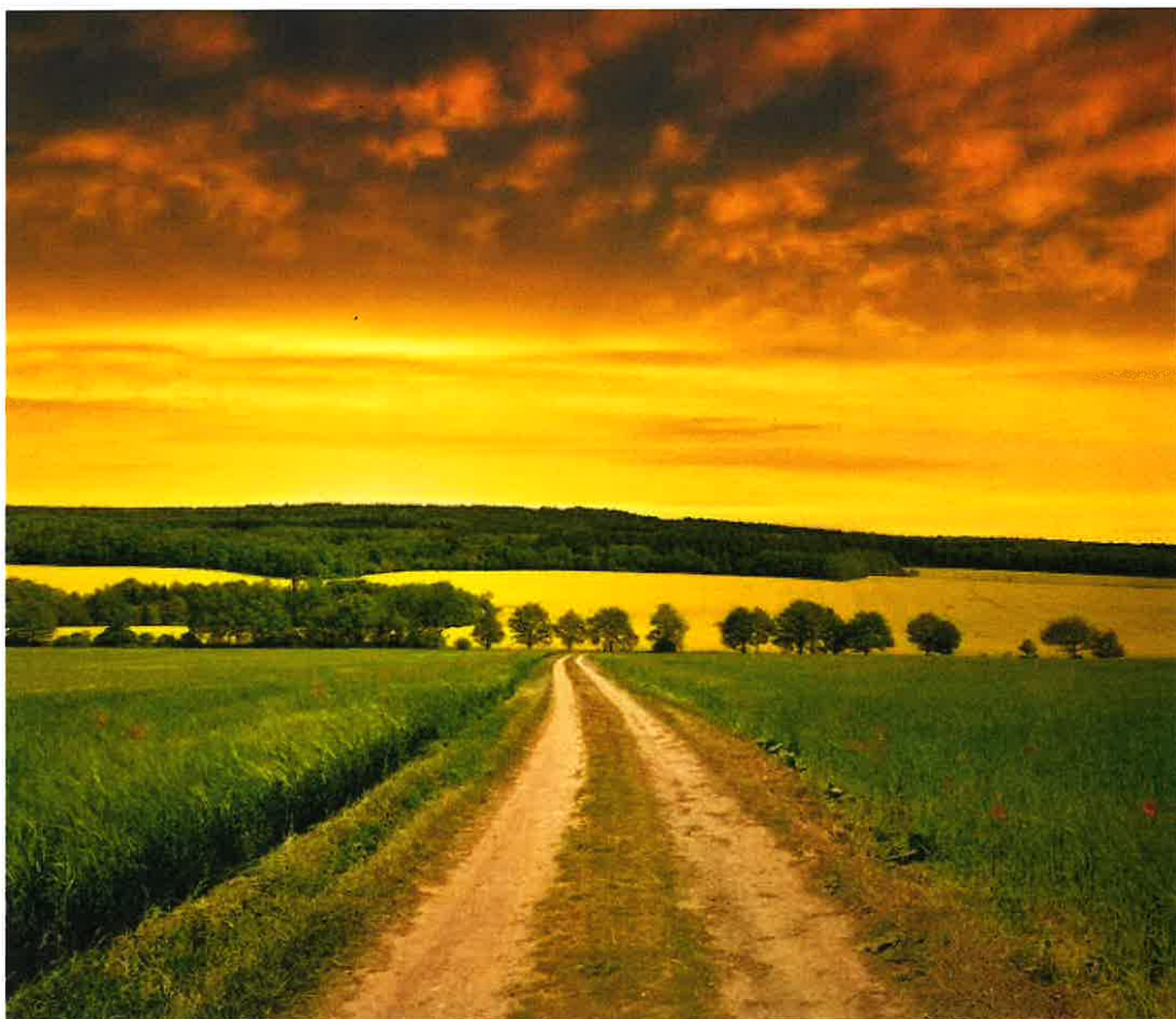

From the CEO



Monthly Update: Where We Stand & Looking Ahead

As we wrap up the month, I'd like to share an update on our progress, how we're tracking against our goals, and what's on the horizon for Edgarley.

Operations & Local Landscape Work on our Storm Damage Repairs remains underway as we push toward completion. While our admissions have been strong, Edgarley is actively navigating the broader headwinds facing our sector—with over 60% of Australian aged care homes currently operating in deficit. We are continuously refining our operations to ensure financial resilience and long-term sustainability.

Industry Insights & Regional Challenges The broader aged care sector is under significant pressure:

Safeguarding Standards: A revamped national screening process for aged care workers is rolling out mid-year to bolster quality and safety standards.

Systemic Strain: Over 3,200 medically cleared patients remain stuck in public hospital beds nationwide. This is driven by a critical infrastructure gap—while Australia requires 10,000 new residential beds annually, only 800 were delivered across the country last fiscal year.

Local Demographics: The Glenelg Shire faces an aging demographic with a median age of 49 (compared to the regional Victorian average of 43). In Casterton, that figure jumps to 59, creating intense demand for 24/7 care and high-level residential placements.

Workforce Shortages: Due to limited regional bed capacity, many local seniors are left waiting in acute health facilities. Compounding this, the outward migration of young people reduces our local labor pool, making recruitment and retention an ongoing hurdle across the sector.

Looking Ahead

Memory Support: We are actively exploring the potential establishment of a dedicated, small-scale Memory Support Unit.

Clinical Excellence: To meet the new medication administration requirements introduced in July 2026, we are thrilled to welcome 3 to 4 new Registered Nurses to our team!

The new farmer said, "Not too well. All 100 chickens died."

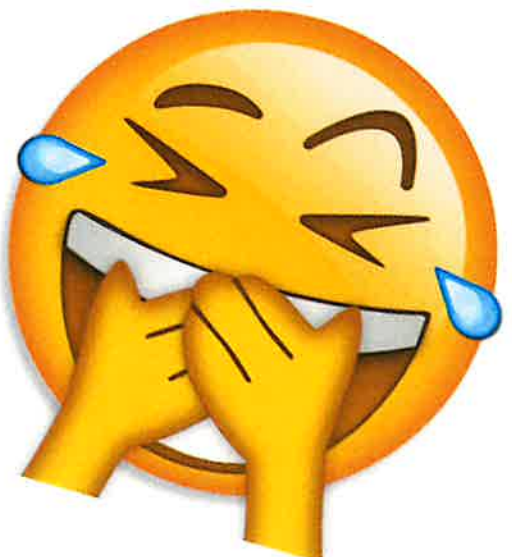
The neighbour said, "Oh, I can't believe that. I've never had any trouble with my chickens. I'll give you 100 more."

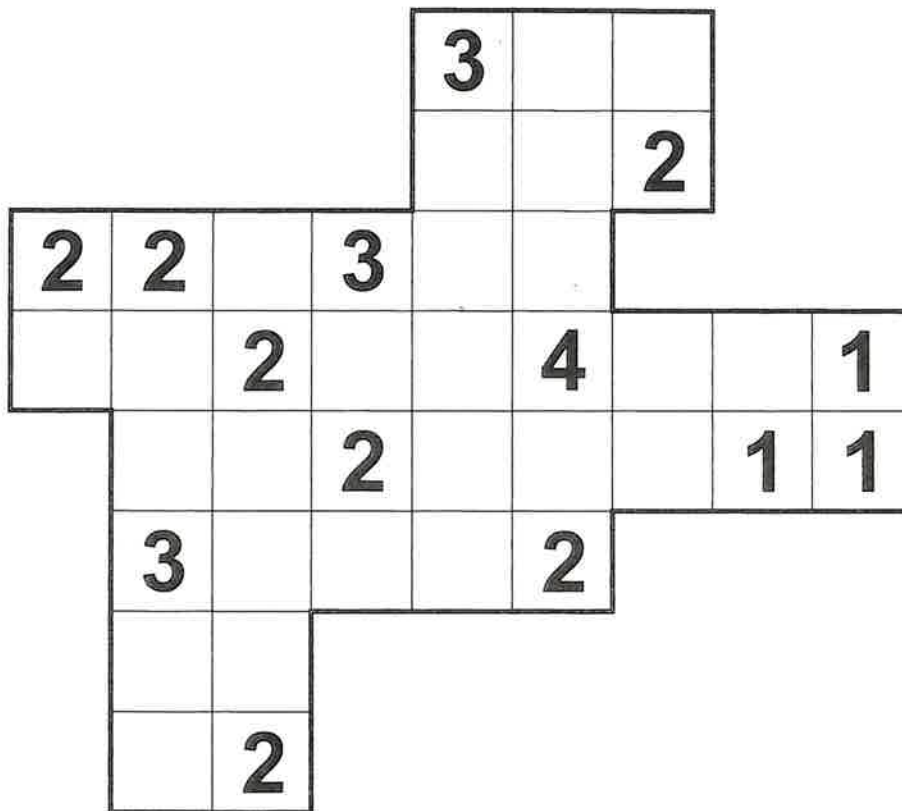
